# The Solidarity Fundraising Product



ActionAid Uganda is a national development organisation affiliated to ActionAid international - a global federation of independent members and national programmes operating in 47 countries across Africa, Asia, Europe and the Americas.

ActionAid has worked in Uganda since 1982 and currently has offices and staff in 15 districts. Through Partners, AAU's reach extends to 36 districts across the country, covering regions where poverty and vulnerability are highest, including Northern Uganda, the North-East, the East and West Nile, and with interventions in the Central Region on the mainland and in Kalangala Islands.

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#### What is Solidarity Fundraising?

Conventional wisdom today has shaped the belief that money for fighting the injustice of poverty is largely from without, and more often bearing influence of western capitals. This belief has perpetuated a dependency mentality and consolidated a victim doctrine that makes our people always look out of their immediate context for money meant for community development and transformation.

Solidarity fundraising challenges this belief and builds on a rich tradition of self-help and collective savings in form of cooperatives model which has a strong history in Uganda. This enhances the idea that resources can be generated from within, and external funding critical as it is, only compliments. It is also aimed at increasing local participation in development financing and accountability for change in the citizens of Uganda.

#### Why Solidarity Fundraising Now?

The fundraising terrain generally is getting more complex by the day and hence the need for innovative approaches. This strategic direction is informed by a number of factors:

- The economic challenges facing the euro-zone which has drastically reduced our sponsorship links from 20,703 in 2007 to 14,275 by end of 2017. Solidarity fundraising seeks to respond to this worrying trend.
- There is a shift of foreign aid from development cooperation areas - poverty and human rights to alignment with foreign policy interests - mainly trade and employment.
- Another trend is of donors pooling resources together in baskets for specific themes of work. This intensifies competition rather than cooperation amongst CSOs.
- Emerging opportunities in Uganda, including the growing size of the middle class, financial inclusion, technology and growth of private sector.
- Increase in social entrepreneurship linked to the capacity of citizens to pool money that can fund development initiatives and support their welfare.

# Who are the targeted supporters of Solidarity Fundraising?

#### How viable is the targeted market?

Market studies so far carried out in this respect have demonstrated encouraging results, for instance;

During the Reflection Action Groups Census (2016), showed that 80% of the surveyed groups were will to contribute financially to ActionAid work. In addition, an AAU staff survey (2017) on Solidarity giving showed that, 92% of surveyed staff were willing to enroll as Solidarity supporters. The outcomes of these two critical surveys have informed the design parameters of this Solidarity product.

The AAU Board has also expressed enthusiasm to sign-up on the programme and all this builds great hope that all the other targeted supporters will receive the programme in no less measure than already demonstrated above when reached out to.

#### How does the programme work?

As a regular source of development financing, it is designed to be a **monthly** giving programme.

As a Supporter, you commit to give a chosen amount of money from the proposed supporter contribution cards.

However, for convenience purposes, you may choose to pay your chosen monthly amount in a **lump sum** on a quarterly, bi-annual or annual basis.

#### How do I pay my contribution?

It is very convenient to make your contribution using the available options to choose from as below:

**Bank** process (Cheque, Cash deposit, Standing order, Transfer)

**Mobile money** platform ( Cash deposit, Transfer)

Cash payment at an ActionAid Office

**Payroll** giving (employer effected salary deduction)

#### Can I change my contribution amount?

Normally, at joining time, you choose an amount that you can conveniently afford to give monthly. A known amount helps both you and ActionAid to plan better. However, in case of extra funds, you have an option to get another Supporter Card of your choice.

What if I am not able to make my monthly payment?

You may defer up to two months' payments, but the plan will be considered abandoned if you miss any three consecutive months.
