Residents denounce Operation Wealth Creation




(Left) Minister Bright Rwamanifesto stated that army officials are being used because they are disciplined. Right, are community members during the Barraza

The Operation Wealth Creation (OWC) program in Pader and Agago districts has come under fire by the community. The residents have come out to denounce the program that is frustrating them. Since its implementation, there are no signs of creation of wealth in their households, but a vicious cycle of poverty.

During a community Baraza conducted last week, the residents demanded that the presidential Program that seeks to create wealth in households under the National Agriculture Advisory services(NAADS) be renamed Operation Poverty creation. The OWC was established in July 2013 by President Museveni . He decided to deploy the army officers after completing a short course at Makerere University to coordinate

Why should we continue with the program when the extension workers were fired? Why should the two weeks trained soldiers assume for the community?"

Its quite unfortunate that the residents did not get answers to the so many questions sampled above. Their community leaders could just look on, bow their heads and in certain instances smile sheepishly.Ismail Akena, a resident from Atanga subcounty added that it has become increasingly difficult for them to demand for services from the soldiers.

"How do you expect me, Akena to question an army officer? How can the community follow up someone with a gun?, he lamented.

During the launch of the Farmers Manifesto last week, Rural women farmers also lamented about their phobia for armed men in uniform. It remains to be seen if the Government will respond to this outcry. However, he informed the meeting that Tullow and Total both companies that will be handling Uganda's oil would have their production licenses before end of year.
